




Anne Frank: The Diary of a Young Girl remains one of the best known books to come out of World War II. In 75 years, it has sold more than 30 million copies in 70 languages, and been read by adults and young students around the world. It is a remarkable portrait of eight Jews hiding from the Nazis for two years in a 'secret annex' — as told by a remarkably mature and perceptive girl who was only 13 when she began the diary.


In 2005, British composer James Whitbourn, working with librettist Melanie Challenger, completed turning excerpts from the famous diary into *Annelies*, a choral work of haunting beauty. (Annelies was Anne's full first name.) Its 14 movements cover the two years between the family's decision to go into hiding and their eventual capture. Throughout, chilling dramatic passages are balanced by soaring melodies and expressions of hope.

We have timed these concerts to commemorate International Holocaust Remembrance Day (January 27).

Renowned soprano Lynn Eustis, who sang the title role at the work's U.S. premiere in 2007, will be accompanied by piano, violin, cello, clarinet and the 34 singers of Cantemus.




